

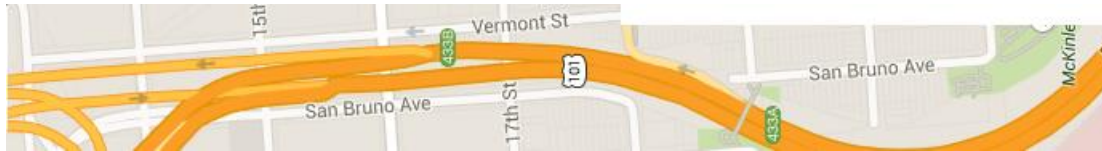

Appendix A

Plan to Address Encampments in Northwest Potrero Hill



- Area: 1) Streets and 101 Right-of-way between San Bruno and Vermont, Division to Mariposa
2) 101 Right-of-way between Mariposa and 20th, both sides of the freeway.

Agreements:

- 1) People living in encampments have overwhelming personal issues and need help resolving them.
- 2) Overnight camping on public sidewalks and on Caltrans right-of-way is illegal and the law should be enforced.
- 3) Every person camping outside needs the following:
 - a. An assessment performed to determine what the individual feels they need to move from their existing condition to housing.
 - b. An individual plan which includes health plan, mental health plan, drug addiction plan
 - c. An understanding of the financial needs of the individual and the sources of funding.
 - d. A social worker assigned to follow up on the individual at a minimum monthly.

Resource and Need assessment.

- 1) HOT, Police and HOPE conduct a general count of the individuals in the Northwest Potrero Area.
- 2) HOPE lists the resources available: Shelters, SROs, communal housing, social workers
- 3) HOPE lists services neighbors could provide (database management, locating meeting places, etc)

First Steps

- 1) HOT and HOPE let neighbors know a) count and b) resources available
- 2) HOT, Police and HOPE triage the individuals identified in the Northwest Potrero Hill area
- 3) HOT and HOPE report progress to Potrero Connect group and discuss ways Potrero Connect group can help.
